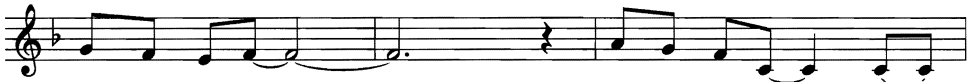

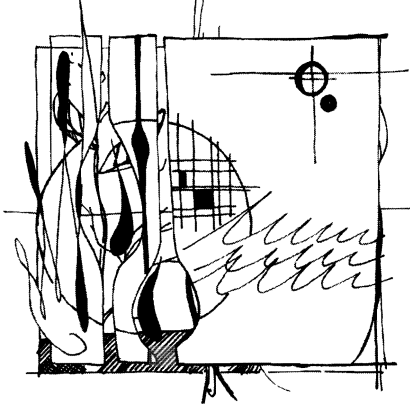

## our sacraments and rites 227



### HOLY ORDERS

All who are baptized make up "a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation" (1 Peter 2:9), a people set apart to offer the eternal sacrifice of Jesus Christ. Still, since the time of the apostles, God has called some members of the Church to minister to the others through the diaconate and the priesthood. In the sacrament of holy orders a man accepts this call from God, which is expressed through the Church's representative, the bishop.

Ordained deacons, priests, and bishops have a unique role within the Catholic community and exercise this service by teaching, leading worship, and offering pastoral guidance.

The sacrament of holy orders has distinct rites for the ordination of bishops, priests, and deacons. A bishop is always the minister of the sacrament. Each rite includes an imposition of hands by the bishop on the head of the one being ordained, signifying the outpouring of the gifts of the Holy Spirit for ministry. *RK*
